Our Story

Founded in 2018, the Spirit of Independence film festival showcases films with limited finances and resources, highlighting exciting voices without Hollywood budgets. We provide a platform for films that other festivals may not.

The festival has grown each year, expanding the number of screenings it shows as well as bringing in local talent to highlight the wealth of filmmakers in the Yorkshire region and beyond.

Next, we want to inspire a new generation of filmmakers to make their stories a cinematic reality and that's why this year we're continuing our Emerging Spirit Scrip to Screen Competition, in partnership with some of the best local filmmaking talent and companies in the region.

Do you want to make your story a reality but just don't have the resources to make it happen? Well, read on....



The Competition

We will support a filmmaking team to make their script a reality. Together with our partners, we will provide the competition winner with a package of resources that will support them to turn their script into a short film during 2024. Their finished short will also be guaranteed a screening at the Spirit of Independence Film Festival in September 2024.

We will be offering the following to the winner of the Emerging Spirit Script to Screen Competition:

- Minimum £500 cash
- Free equipment hire from South Yorkshire Filmmakers'
 Network
- Free use of post-production facilities at The Kurious
- Free colour grading from Colourist Paul Handley
- Free digital effects from Bluespec Digital
- Free festival strategy consultation from Festival Formula
- Production support by Open House Pictures
- Editing support by Ora FIlms
- Mentorship by a member of the BFI Network



Past winners

Our inaugural competition was won by first-time director Ciara O'Rourke with her coming-of-age body horror 'Dead Skin' The film has since played such prestigious festivals as Aesthetica, Frightfest and Leeds International Film Festival.





The 2023 competition was won by Ed Kirk and his moody, folk horror-inflected drama 'Black Dog'. The film is currently preparing for it's festival run


The Rules

Sound good so far? There are conditions in order to meet the competition criteria:

- All films must be made in the Yorkshire region
- Scripts should be submitted in traditional script format as a PDF
- Scripts must be no longer than 12 pages in length
- The festival directors and the competition sponsors must be credited as Executive Producers
- Logos of the festival and the award sponsor must be displayed at the beginning of the film
- All scripts must be submitted via filmfreeway.
- A submission fee of c.£10 applies
- Projects need to have a writer, director and producer attached before an application can be made. Teams need to have a minimum of two individuals across the three creative roles, e.g. separate individuals who are a writer-director and producer respectively, or a director working with a writer-producer. Director-producers are not eligible to apply
